

ABOUT THIS PROJECT

NRB Modular Solutions partnered with the City of Toronto to build <u>11 Macey Avenue</u>, the first of two modular buildings that were completed providing 100 new homes.

The goal was to support people who are experiencing homelessness by providing affordable homes with additional support services.



HOW IT WORKS

A modular building is made of prefabricated modules that are built off-site in a factory while the site is being prepared for installation, allowing projects to be completed up to 50% faster than conventional site-built construction. 11 Macey Avenue opened on December 19, 2020, approximately eight months after being approved by City Council.



The three-storey rental apartment building consisted of 56 studio apartments, common rooms, a dining room, program space, and administrative offices.
