Shared commitment to safe communities

- Like the government, we are committed to building and maintaining **safe**, **healthy communities** across Ontario.
- As non-profit, community-based organizations, we operate differently than private landlords. Any new legislation must recognize and reflect these differences.

Concerns about the legislation

- Bill 10 is broad and ambiguous, making it difficult to understand how it will be applied in practice.
- Clearer regulations and guidance are needed.
- Our goal remains the same as the province's: **ensuring safety and well-being for all tenants and community members.**

Safety investments and financial pressures

- We ask that **front-line workers and providers** be meaningfully consulted as regulations are developed.
- Their real-world experience is critical to shaping practical, effective, and fair policy.

Collaborating on solutions

- We want to work with the government to ensure new rules are realistic, enforceable, and sustainable.
- Together, we can keep communities safe without undermining the ability of non-profit providers to deliver affordable housing.
